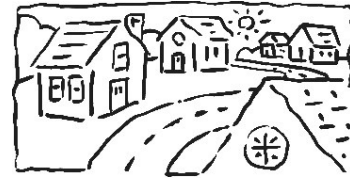

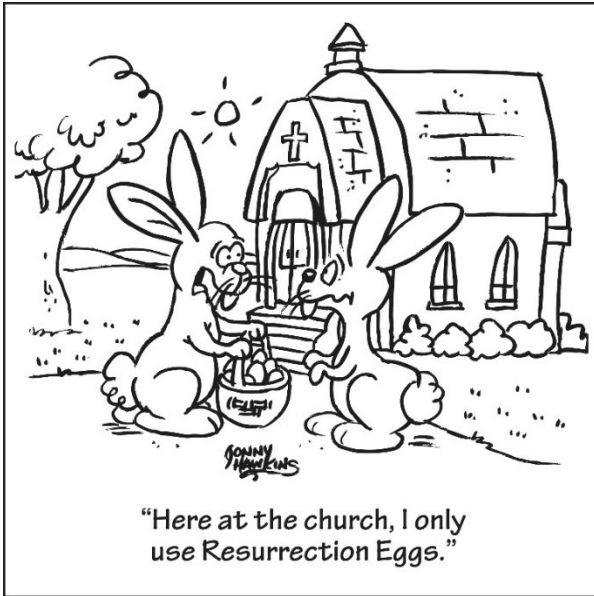
LOCAL MISSIONS

Taking Up the Cross

“That’s her cross to bear,” it’s said of someone’s hardship or inconvenience. The challenge might be as serious as poverty or as trivial as crabby neighbors. However, when Jesus called people to “take up their cross,” he didn’t mean it that way. Nor was he referring to anyone imposing suffering on another.

When Jesus said, “If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me” (Matthew 16:24 and parallels), he spoke of a radical new way to engage a society that more often called people to take up swords and fight for self-preservation. He called people to peace, not violence — and from being self-focused to following him.

That is also Jesus’ call today. The cross isn’t a euphemism that lets us dismiss someone’s suffering. We don’t appoint someone else to bear it. When we choose the cross, we do so for ourselves in response to Jesus’ invitation that, one way or another, ultimately leads through death to new life.

Pastor's Post

Reflection of the Church

A

I am your church. Make of me what you will. I reflect you as clearly as a mirror. If outwardly my appearance is pleasing and inviting, it is because you made me so. If within; my spiritual atmosphere is kindly, yet earnest; reverent, yet friendly; worshipful, yet sincere; sympathetic, yet strong; divine, yet humanly expressed; it is but the manifestation of the spirit of you who constitute my membership. You are the church: you know!

But if you should, by chance, find me a bit cold and dull, I beg of you not to condemn the rest of us, for I show forth the only kind of life I shall receive from you. I have no life or spirit apart from you.

Of this may you always be assured: I, your church, will respond instantly to your every wish practically expressed, for I am the reflected image of your own soul! Make of me what you will. (copied)

In Romans 12:6-11 Paul says: We have different gifts, according to the grace given us. If a man's gift is prophesying, let him use it in proportion to his faith. ⁷If it is serving, let him serve; if it is teaching, let him teach; ⁸if it is encouraging, let him encourage; if it is contributing to the needs of others, let him give generously; if it is leadership, let him govern diligently; if it is showing mercy, let him do it cheerfully. ⁹Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. ¹⁰Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves. ¹¹Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord.

I truly hope you are excited about the possibilities available to Holy Neck Church as we work through the Intentional Interim Process. I will be leading the Transition Team to examine many aspects of ministry the church is performing and to consider many new actions. The team will lead the congregation to consider ministry actions to project Christ through the Holy Neck ministry into the community presenting God's love to all people. They may ask you to consider some new ministry they envision and try it in order to reach people we have not been reaching. The outcome of intentionally examining the church and the resulting actions is totally up to the Transition Team and you the

congregation. I am only to be the facilitator for thought, contemplation and consideration of ministry while I am serving as your intentional interim pastor.

If you desire for Holy Neck to reflect God's love both within and into the community, I would ask that you prayerfully consider the ministry ideas the transition team will bring before you and ask yourself: "Is it possible that this just might be what is needed to get my wayward family members, neighbors and friends back into church for spiritual growth and fellowship? Is this possibly something that will truly make a significant spiritual impact upon our community or the world?"

If you believe it has value; give it your best effort. I cannot give you a guarantee that this approach will do the job, but I can assure you that the intentional interim ministry process is working in many churches that have been struggling. Also, it shows promise of being a pivotal experience that will help you (personally and corporately as a body) make a spiritual impact upon the community for Christ.

So then, pray for and discuss each possibility when the team brings it to you. They will have discussed, questioned, and prayed about it long before you hear about it. Decide if it is right for you personally. If it isn't, but it could possibly have potential for cutting edge ministry to others, then commit to encourage the church to try it though you personally have no interest. The Holy Spirit will lead in the process and that which will make Holy Neck a shining light of God's love to the community will happen.

Most of all remember this. The only difference between success and failure is that success got up one more time than it fell. Both success and failure fall many times. If we have never failed at something, then we have never tried anything new.

I have had my share of failures in life and in ministry proposals. I have set my heart upon Christ and learned that when I let Him lead, I learn!

Failings have often made me stronger, more humbled, and brought me closer to Christ. If in the midst of struggles, you find yourself overwhelmed by adversity then say ABC to yourself. (Adversity Builds Character). If we don't let God build our character through adversity, then we are likely to allow adversity to bring cynicism.
